A. CLASSES AND TIME STANDARDS

1. Classes of Swimming Competition

- **a.** The following are brief descriptions of the types of meet classes offered on the Arizona competition schedule. Some differences may occur from meet to meet.
 - 1) AzSI Championship Meets. At least two senior championship and two age group championship meet opportunities shall be offered each USA Swimming calendar year (September 1 August 31). Specific details shall be set by the Technical Chair and published as part of the annual bid process. Qualifying times for these meets are the Arizona A Standard for each age group.
 - 2) Arizona Swimming ABC Time Standard (Senior). This class of meet is open to athletes who meet the qualifying standard for the senior age group. Standards are posted on the Arizona Swimming website. Meets may be held in conjuction with the Age Group standards. Meets may be held as A, B, C, or combination thereof (A/B/C, A/B, B/C, A/C, etc.)
 - 3) Arizona Swimming ABC Time Standard (Age Group). This class of meet is open to athletes who meet the qualifying standards for a particular age group. Standards are posted on the Arizona Swimming website. Meets may be held in conjuction with the Senior time standards. Meets may be held as A, B, or C or combinations thereof (A/B/C, A/B, B/C, A/C, etc.).
 - 4) No Time Standard (NTS). This class of meet does not require a qualifying time to enter.
 - 5) 8 & Under. This class of meet is open to athletes 8 years of age or younger. These meets may be a 1 day, single session meets or the class may be intermingled with the events of another meet with the following age groups: 6 & Under, 7 year olds, 8 year olds. The 8 and Under Championship Meet sessions shall be run separately, no other classes to be included.
 - 6) Pool Open Water. Pool Open Water swimming is used when access to an actual Open Water site is unavailable. The number of loops can be

determined based on the age of the competitors. This competition can be open to any athlete and has no time standards.

7) Open Water Swimming. Any swimming competition that takes place in rivers, lakes, or oceans subject to the rules and regulations for age and time as specified by USA Swimming.

2. Time Standards

- **a.** Time standards regulate the qualifying of athletes for a given class of competition and are set based on the recommendation of Technical Planning Committee and approved by the House of Delegates. No converted times may be used, except as stated in paragraph e below.
- **b.** If an athlete achieves a Senior or Age Group (A/B/C) Qualifying Standard in short course they shall enter a long course meet with their short course time if the meet allows for such entry and vice versa.
- **c.** Time standards will be published annually and available on Arizona Swimming's web site. There are <u>no</u> time standards for the 8 & Under age group, except that for the Championship meet the swimmers must have legally completed the race prior to the Championship meet entry deadline.
- **d.** Custom time standards may be used for other selected meets.
- **e.** Times achieved at an altitude of 3,000 feet or more may be adjusted as provided by USA Swimming for the purpose of entering an Arizona Q+ meet.
- **g.** National Reportable Age Group Time is the time standard used for compiling the Top 16 USA Swimming age group times for each season. These are compiled automatically by USA Swimming through SWIMS.
- h. Times achieved by USA Swimming athlete members in collegiate, high school, and YMCA meets not sanctioned or approved by Arizona Swimming will be acceptable for USA Swimming Reportable Times only if all of the following conditions are met:
 - 1) The meet must be a championship meet or a meet specifically authorized by USA Swimming Program Operations.
 - 2) Request for USA Swimming observers must be made to the Officials Chairman at least 10 days prior to the meet.
 - 3) USA Swimming observers shall be certified stroke and turn judges assigned and approved by Arizona Swimming.
 - 4) Sufficient numbers of observers must be on deck at each end of the course to verify USA Swimming Rules compliance.

- 5) Times of observed swims must be submitted to AzSI in an electronic format that may be uploaded into the USA Swimming database, SWIMS.
 - a. such times must include all information necessary to uploading, including but not limited to registered name, USAS id number, event, time achieved etc.
 - b. Non-electronic times are not acceptable.
